Important Points to Remember:

- PPE is an essential component of Standard and Transmission-Based Precautions
- Being able to correctly apply and remove PPE helps ensure that they work in the intended manner
- Appropriate removal of PPE ranks among one of the most critical of topics in infection prevention
- Keep gloved hands away from face and avoid touching or adjusting other PPE
- Remove gloves if they become torn; perform hand hygiene before donning new gloves
- Limit surfaces and items touched while wearing PPF

Removing Personal Protective Equipment

RATIONALE: To outline the sequence of events for appropriately removing (doffing) Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).


Sequence for doffing PPE:

- Gloves.
- Hand Hygiene.
- Face shield or goggles (if applicable).
- Gown is to be removed at the doorway, before leaving patient room. Hand Hygiene.
- PPE for airborne precautions must be removed in the anteroom.
- Remove respirator or N-95 mask outside of the room, after the door has been closed. Hand Hygiene.



Doffing PPE:

Gloves should be removed as pictured below:



- Grasp ear or head pieces of face shield or goggles with ungloved hands and lift away from face. Place in designated receptacle for reprocessing or disposal.
- Unfasten ties and peel gown away from neck and shoulder. Turn contaminated outside toward the inside. Fold or roll into a bundle and discard. Perform Hand Hygiene!
- Removal of a cone mask: grasp elastic from behind head and remove the mask from face. Handle only the elastic strap from the mask and discard.
- Removal of an N-95 mask: Lift the bottom elastic over your head first and then lift off the top elastic and discard. Remember to only handle the mask by the elastic straps. Perform Hand Hygiene!
